Free Workshop for Parents: On-line Safety

On the back of this newsletter is information regarding a free workshop for parents to support you with keeping your children safe on-line. This workshop has been organised by WSCC and Arun District Council in conjunction with O2, the NSPCC and children's charity Barnardo's. This is a FREE online safety workshop for parents called Stay Safe at the Newtown Sports & Social Club: 16A Greencourt Drive, Bognor Regis PO21 5EU at 6pm on Thursday 8th November. They would like parents, carers and quardians, grandparents and others to join them for this informative event delivered by trained NSPCC staff. The 2 hour workshop is a great opportunity to gain skills and knowledge to try and understand the internet and technology as children see it. The workshop will cover topics such as: online games and cyber bullying, through to setting up privacy settings and controls as well as ways to help you have the right conversations with your children about online safety. The training is aimed at 7 - 11 year olds; however parents of younger children may also find it useful. As this is an early evening session aimed at adults, children are unable to attend. Please ensure you have appropriate childcare arranged as there will be no one on site to look after your child.
