As you may know, children in Years R to 2 are entitled to a free hot school meal under the Universal Free School Meal scheme. This was a Government initiative brought in several years ago. Recently, we have been finding that on some days, there are a lot of plates left over which means there is a lot of wasted food being thrown away. I'm sure that you would agree that we should not be throwing good food away. The school meals have to be ordered over a week in advance and so the school office need to know when children will not be taking up the hot lunch meal and having their own packed lunch instead.
