We have now been in lockdown for ten days and I hope that you are all adjusting, again, and you are coping well during these challenging times. None of us at school underestimates how hard it is to home school the children again.

Many of us are having to balance teaching, planning work and teaching our own children too. Thank you for all of the amazing and positive feedback from parents who have sent messages and who have regularly communicated with the teachers. This is very much appreciated. All of the staff are working very hard. Some of you have shared your worries with us too. Please hang in there. The DfE expects us to set between 3-4 hours of work per day. Naturally we do have to follow this requirement and ensure that we are providing the children with enough work to support their learning. We also have to ask you to monitor what your child is doing so that there is engagement everyday. As we have said before, home learning is never going to be quite the same as at school but the teachers are planning recorded live lessons and a range of activities to support you all in the best ways. Please do what you can. This is a partnership; we ask that the children submit regular (daily) pieces so that they don't fall behind their peers. They need to engage with us so we can continue to assess their needs and interests. Some have not submitted any work and so we will contact you to ask why as part of our duty of care.

Key Worker Places

You may be aware that the DfE guidance eligibility for school places changed at last week. The DfE state that if a child of a critical worker can be looked after at home them they should be e.g. on shift workers' days off or if working from home. We have worked so hard to balance the demand for this, however, we continue to receive requests from critical workers being asked to increase their hours. We now need all families using in-school provision, in Year 1 and 2 to urgently review their current work demands and let us know if they are able to release a place in school even if it is just for one/a few days a week.
