BEHAVIOUR AND BAD LANGUAGE

We are lucky that behaviour at Bartons is consistently very good but there are few occasions that children do not meet our high standards. We like to catch children being good and praising good behaviour is at the heart of our school. Recently, there have been some incidents that show some children making poor choices. School staff are very experienced with dealing with this but in the last week, I have had 3 complaints from parents about some Bartons children swearing outside of school in the park. In assembly, I explained that hearing bad language from children is appalling and that poor behaviour outside of school, whilst wearing your school uniform, reflects badly on our school. We talked about making good choices and not behaving in a way that would disappoint and upset your family. We take a tough line on bad and inappropriate language/behaviour and I would ask that you talk to your child/ren about the consequences of displaying these behaviours including rudeness. Our behaviour rules and policy are very clear and I expect all pupils to know and understand these.
