Communication and Language

<u>Speaking:</u> Talk about teddy likes/dislikes; responding and answering/asking questions. <u>Listening</u>: Listening to a variety of stories and poems about teddies <u>Understanding</u>: Understand what tools are used for Develop understanding of prepositions eg under, behind, Follow instructions about placing objects

Literacy

Continue to develop phonic knowledge and word building skills. Build understanding of rhyme. <u>Writing:</u> use phonics knowledge to write words, captions and sentences, Write descriptions of teddies. <u>Reading</u>: listen and respond to stories and information about bears. Reading simple sentences in books and around us.

Mathematics

<u>Counting</u>: - securing knowledge of numbers to 20 - recognition and ordering, counting accurately, Making 10 using different coloured teddies and numicon shapes. Adding and subtracting small numbers

<u>Shape, Space and Measures:</u> Match shapes, copy and continue patterns

Compare sizes and capacity. Measuring using teddy rulers, balance scales for weighing and comparing.

<u>Vocabulary</u>: full, empty, tall, short, big small, medium-sized Positional & directional, words eg.

Forwards, backwards, etc





Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Respect for other people's belongings, when each child brings in their own teddy.

Taking care of other people's belongings and teddies brought into school.

Taking care of your own belongings, looking after your teddy.

Sharing toys and various materials with others, turn-taking.
