## Free School Meals

As I reported last week, the government have put in place a scheme whereby schools can organise shopping vouchers for those families registered for free school meals in this period of lockdown. Please note that this is not the same for the children in Years R. 1 and 2 scheme in receipt of the universal free school meal. Edenred, the company instructed by the government, have had initial problems in setting this process up but I am pleased to say that this morning, I have been able to order the vouchers online and they should be sent directly via email to families by the 20th April. These vouchers can then be redeemed against shopping from your supermarket of choice and should be done within a month. It has been very frustrating trying to organise these vouchers because the national company have had major system outages over the last few weeks but I am hopeful that this has now been sorted. Please get in touch with us if nothing appears after the 20th April.
