Dear Parents

Happy New Year! The children have settled back into school well after the Christmas break and despite coughs, colds and the usual winter bugs, they are already getting on with their learning enthusiastically. We are really looking forward to all of the exciting things that we have planned for the children this half term.

Our Learning Journey

Our new topic 'It's a Bear!' was launched last week with a variety of bears arriving in Elm class as well as stories and poems about different bears. It has already generated much discussion and excitement for the children.

We will be exploring old and new bears with the children and discussing how these are similar or different to our own toys. Linked to this we will read Old Bear stories. We will be thinking about lots of different aspects of toy bears; finding out what they are made of, sorting them, playing with them and having our own adventures!

By using books and the internet we will find out facts about real bears, comparing them and writing about them.

Phonics sessions will continue daily and these will be taught in groups to allow the children to make progress at their own pace; developing knowledge of letters and sounds, blending for reading and beginning to look at simple rules for spelling and writing.

Other core skills will be embedded into the children's learning and we will continue with our morning carousel groups to focus learning in key areas within small groups and importantly, developing fine motor skills so that we can improve our handwriting.

Home Bear Diary project

We will be launching a new project in Elm Class this term. The children will have the opportunity to bring home a class bear along with a story book and diary /notebook. We will be encouraging them to record their stay at home with pictures; drawings or a photo with a simple sentence telling us how they spent their time together. More explanation will be enclosed in the bag when it comes home to you. Please support your child in this work as they love to share their experiences when they return to school. It is a great way to help children to learn about each other and build relationships with friends as they talk about and read the book. It also gives them a purpose to write and even use technology and develop their confidence in speaking.

We will soon be sending home a Stars and Wishes sheet, a short report written half way through the year. These give lots of areas to focus on with the children's learning. If you have not already done so please return the parent comment sheet sent last term so that we can build a full picture of your child's achievements and interests.

PE kits and earrings

Our PE sessions will continue to be on Thursdays so please ensure all earrings are removed on this day and that long hair is tied back securely. It is a good idea to leave PE kits in school all week in case we need to swap sessions with another class at any time.
