Last night you will have seen the announcement by the Prime Minister. sure that it raised many

questions for you, in respect of your own work and your child's. I need to let you know that I heard about the potential reopening of schools at exactly the same time as you did and so with little information at the moment, we don't have many answers to questions that parents may have. Boris Johnson outlined who the year groups might be but not how this would happen in reality. He also said that only if certain measures had been achieved could schools then be in a position to accept more pupils. I want to reassure you that behind the scenes there have been many on-going conversations about this roadmap but we are still uncertain of what the scientific evidence is and what will happen re: the virus in the next few weeks. Please be patient whilst we process the facts and guidance from the DfE which we are currently waiting for. We are working on a plan but although Boris Johnson implied that it could be Years R, 1 and 6 who will have a phased return, we are still uncertain about that. I'm sure parents would recognise that social distancing in school with young children will be highly challenging. We will provide you with more information in due course. As a parent myself and being a Headteacher, I still need assurances from the Government and the Local Authority that safety is being put first for our children and my staff.

School continues to be open but only for key worker and vulnerable children only. The Government key worker list hasn't changed and so the safest place for children is still at home. Please be mindful that we cannot accept children who do not meet the criteria and so please be supportive of this. Thank you.
