The governing body would like to thank parents/carers for taking the time to answer our questionnaire. A total 60 questionnaires (28%) were returned with a variety of comments.

The feedback from parents was extremely positive which we believe reflects our Team Bartons ethos and the continuing improvement and development of the School.

We are encouraged that so many of you feel that your child is happy at school, is making good progress and you feel that they are supported in their learning. We really value the feedback that you have given us. Many of you commented how approachable and welcoming all our staff are for example:

Great school and staff-you all work very hard for us'

'My child's happiness and the level of learning she receives is amazing

'Teachers all very caring and approachable. My daughter is always keen to go to school which is testament to the environment at Bartons'.

A number of you commented on the school environment for example:

'We really like the welcoming & inclusive atmosphere for the pupils it still manages to foster, even after moving to a new setting'.

The environment, quality of teaching staff and the strong lead from the new headteacher'.

'Teachers are great, very supportive and helpful'.

'Friendly environment, my child loves this school'.

'Lovely school building and classrooms'.

'Small school, bright and airy, good equipment and outdoor space'.

'School environment supporting disabilities in a community setting'.

There were a few aspects of the school that you feel needed improvement and below we respond to some of these:

Communication - the school keeps parents up to date by a variety of media including facebook, the website, text messages and the weekly newsletter - as can be seen from your responses in the table above the newsletter is the most popular. If you have specific concerns about your child please talk to the class teacher.

47% of parents do not know how to contact school governors- the Governing Body can be contacted via the school secretary who will pass your query to the chair of governors. This information has also been added to the contact section of the website. The governor section of the website also explains the role of the governing body.

Many of you commented on **parking issues** at the school which is something really beyond our control. However as the Bersted Park development grows more roads will be open which we believe will ease the parking and access situation. Safe parking and access is everyone's responsibility and we would like to thank you for your co-operation in keeping children safe around the school.

Behaviour - the school has a robust behaviour policy which is on the website - this policy clearly states what actions that will be taken in specific circumstances. As stated in the Behaviour Management policy "we believe that children have a right to be happy, feel safe and to be respected. All adults will work positively with all children. Children will be encouraged to be responsible for their own behaviour. Any adult working in school will follow the procedures in the policy. We will not accept any form of bullying and will take all allegations seriously". Appendix 1 of the policy gives clear expectations and consequences for poor behaviour.

We shall continue to focus on and work with the headteacher on those issues that you have identified.

We appreciate that you support Mrs Powell in her drive to improve outcomes at Bartons and we are sure that she will continue to address any issues relating to the day to day running of the school.
