## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Please can I remind all parents that at the beginning and end of the school day, you should not enter under the school canopy and approach the classroom doors to speak to the class teachers. The staff have been told not to come outside and you must remain at a 2 metre distance and be mindful of our current risk assessment. We are not being unfriendly but we must all adhere to the rules so that everyone in the school community stays safe. There are signs around the school to remind you. Thank you for your support.

We are now firmly into autumn and the outside temperature has dropped significantly over the last few weeks. Please make sure that the children have and wear a coat which has their name in. The school heating is now on but to remain Covid-19 safe, we are required to keep some of the roof height windows open for good ventilation. This naturally, makes the classroom a little cooler and so we would suggest that to keep the children warm, they have an extra layer on (perhaps a base layer underneath their polo shirt) so that they are unaffected by the cooler air in the classroom. The staff have been asked to do the same. Please note that outside coats will not be allowed to be worn inside the classroom.
