We would like to wish you a very warm welcome to Bartons Primary School. We have had a very busy and exciting time over the last week. It has been a real pleasure getting to know your children and we are very pleased with how they have settled in. Thank you for helping it to happen so smoothly. We are really pleased that many of the children have started coming into school on their own already and we would like to encourage more to do this. We now ask that you leave your child at the door to enable them to build their independence and confidence in sorting out their own belongings. It will also allow them to settle quickly to activities at the start of the day.



Our Learning Journey

We have started the term by getting to know the children through our topic What's in the Box? We have been looking at our Treasure boxes to help us get to know each other and share information with our friends. We will be finding out what we are good at and what we would like to get better at by introducing new activities over the weeks. We will continue to provide lots of different opportunities to develop the children's learning. This will largely be done through self-initiated play supported by a variety of adult focused activities covering all areas of the curriculum.

We have already started to introduce phonics (through listening to sounds) and there has been lots of counting work through songs and games. We will be moving on to rhyming and using sounds we can hear in our names. This work can be supported at home through talk and play as well as by completing the simple activities we will be sending home later in the term.
